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

Dear Parents and Carers,



Please bear with us. We realise that this is extremely frustrating for parents and carers, as it is for school. It can be very inconvenient and frustrating when children need to isolate whilst awaiting test results, or when a bubble is closed, but we must try to stop the spread of infection. The last thing we want is for our entire school to close, as has happened in other local schools.

As we approach the end of term, we are also aware that many of you have holidays planned for the summer break, and again we do not want anybody to be in the positon of isolating and missing their holiday, so it is important that we all remain vigilant now. We would ask that all coming on to the school site continue to practice social distancing and wear a face covering until the end of term.

There are only two weeks left in school now, and we aim to make these as fun-filled and normal as possible for the children.

#### **Transition plans**

As you may or may not know, transition plans for Year 6 going to secondary school have been altered because of government guidance. The Year 6 children are having virtual transition rather than face to face. Year 6 parents have already been informed of this.

Government guidance states that schools can carry out normal transition activities as long as the integrity of bubbles can be maintained. Unfortunately for us, what that means is that we cannot do transition as we normally would because of our mixed classes. In some cases, mixing for transition would mean children from 5 different bubbles spending the day in the same class. With current guidance and the rates of infection increasing again, we are not allowed to do this.

The classes for next year have all been decided carefully with a range of factors taken into consideration. Current and new teachers have met to pass on necessary information about how your child learns; areas of strength/areas for development; friendship groups; set new SEND support plan targets, review medical care plans etc. to ensure that your child's new class teacher knows all about them before they start back in September.

In order for the children to find out who their new teacher is without it just being read from a list, their new teachers are currently busy writing a letter to them to introduce themselves. The children will receive these early next week and will then know who their new class teacher is.

Some children need extra transition for a variety of reasons and staff have been working hard to ensure that this will be happening despite current restrictions. If you believe your child needs extra transition but have not been contacted about how this will be happening, please get in touch.



#### **Reception children**

For children in Reception moving to Year 1, we know that this is an important step and so the children will meet their new class teacher this week for story time on the school field. They will also spend time with their new class teacher next week.

In order for them to get used to the classrooms etc., the children will be taken for a walk to see the rooms/hall etc. in small groups this week while the Y1/2 children have PE outside.

To allow parents to ask any questions that you may have, KS1 staff will be sending you a KS1 welcome booklet and also organising a TEAMS presentation and Q and A session on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> July and Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> July after school.

#### Year 2

Our Year 2 children who will be moving to the upper school building in September, are going to be taken up to see their new classrooms in small groups this week. We will send out more information for parents regarding pick up and drop off procedures for KS2 when we know the arrangements for September.
