What are SATs?

- National tests taken by Year 6 children in reading, maths, spelling, grammar and punctuation
- Set and marked externally
- Results used to measure a school's performance
- Used in conjunction with teacher assessment to give a broad picture of your child's attainment at the end of primary school

Focus: Relevant sections of the English Programmes of Study

Format: 2 papers

Paper 1 - Questions

- A combined question and answer booklet
- Children have 45 minutes to complete
- Questions designed to assess children's knowledge and understanding of a range of grammar and punctuation terms
- Total of 50 marks

Paper 2 - Spelling

- The administrator reads a test transcript
- Children complete 20 spellings in an answer booklet
- Should take approximately 15 minutes to complete
- Total of 20 marks

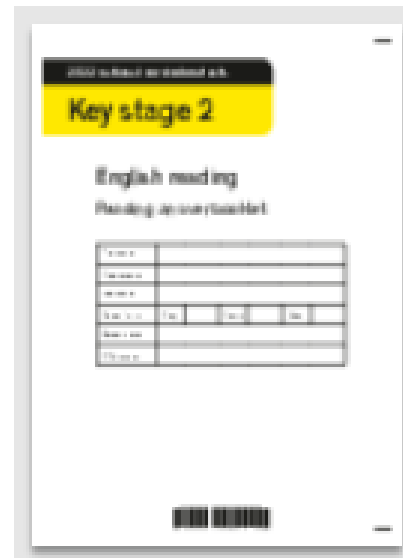
